

Known as P-71 (P for Private Forest), this was the first CCC camp in Prince William County. It consisted of a lookout tower used to detect forest fires. Built in 1933, Camp Recovery cost \$30,000 to build and gave \$10,000 a month to the local businesses. By January of 1934, the men stationed at Camp Recovery achieved almost all of their goals in regard to fire control in the Prince William County area.

No original structure remains, however the grounds now house the Coles District Fire Station (pictured). A former fire station to the right is currently being torn down, and the memorial plaque has been moved to a county building.
